Australian Internet Community - planning a way forward

An informal group of interested stakeholders is working together to develop a plan for a sustainable national initiative that will – in the future – provide opportunities for the Australian internet community to discuss and address internet governance issues.

The work of this group aligns with Linux Australia's values to ensure that open technology is available to all regardless of background or circumstances, and to ensure more diverse representation in technology policy decision making.

But, importantly, we are hoping that Linux may be able to contribute a small sum to cover the travel arrangements of some participants.

Background

The Australian Internet Governance Forum (auIGF) ran for five years from 2012-2016. The idea of the auIGF was based on the Global IGF – to bring government, industry and community members together in an open, apolitical, multi-stakeholder environment, to exchange ideas and best practice around Internet governance.

The auIGF was organised, hosted and supported by .au Domain Administration Ltd (auDA), with input from other key stakeholders. After the 2016 auIGF, auDA announced that its future facilitation of the auIGF would cease.

At a meeting of Australian Internet community stakeholders convened in May 2017 by the Australian Ambassador for Cyber Affairs, Dr Tobias Feakin, there was general consensus that an auIGF-type event would be of benefit in facilitating discussion and consultation on Internet governance issues.

In October 2017, the Australian Government Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade officially launched Australia's International Cyber Engagement Strategy. In it, the government notes that Australia is an advocate for a multi-stakeholder approach to Internet governance, and that the government will "Support an annual community-led Australian Internet governance and cooperation forum" (point 5.02, page 61).

Planning a way forward

An informal group of interested stakeholders is now working together to determine what an "annual community-led Australian Internet governance and cooperation forum" might look like, and how to ensure such a forum remains sustainable in the longer term.

The informal group consists of:

- The independent Chair (Sandra Davey funded by DFAT)
- An independent secretariat (ACIG funded by DFAT)
- Representatives from the Australian Government Department of Communications and the Arts
- Representatives from the Australian Government Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade
- Volunteer representatives from the following organisations:
 - Internet Australia
 - o APNIC (Asia-Pacific Network Information Centre)
 - ACCAN (Australian Communications Consumer Action Network)

- EFA (Electronic Frontiers Australia)
- o auDA

Single-day workshop, in Canberra

The group plans to hold a single-day workshop, in Canberra, to develop a plan for a sustainable national initiative that will – in the future – provide opportunities for the Australian internet community to discuss and address internet governance issues.

The Canberra meeting is not, itself, to be a forum for capacity building, or the discussion of internet governance issues.

The informal group is currently working together to develop an agenda for the day and prepare a list of people to invite to participate in the single-day planning workshop.

The informal group is aiming to have around 50 invited participants on the day, and will try to ensure:

- that the people who come to the Canberra meeting are the people with enough seniority, expertise and resources to take on the initiation of a national forum;
- participants at the Canberra meeting are diverse and representative of the Australian internet community; and
- that all participants understand what they are expected to work towards, and achieve, at the Canberra meeting.

The single-day planning workshop is scheduled for Thursday 19 July, at the Hotel Kurrajong, Barton, ACT.

The outcome of the meeting will be an agreed plan for a sustainable national initiative that will – in the future – provide opportunities for the Australian internet community to discuss and address internet governance and cooperation issues, many of these technical in nature.

Representation and Civil Society

There are people we believe need to be represented in the strategy development process that otherwise do not have the means to participate. While many participants have organisations or employers that are able to cover accommodation and travel, others do not. We are seeking support to provide for five individuals that collectively represent:

- improved gender diversity;
- regional representation;
- civil society;
- open-source and community technology advocates;
- independent journalism; and
- youth representation.

These are not token participants, their contribution ensures increased diversity of representation which we believe is crucial in shaping how technology policy decision making might work.

We know the voices of women and those without the economic means to evenly participate reduces the effectiveness of multistakeholder engagement at a time when internet, technology and open technology policy is having an increased impact on society and policy development.

Grant Funding Request

A detailed breakdown of costs is provided as an attachment to this letter, and a summary is provided below.

We are seeking travel funding for five individuals.

Accommodation: \$500 : (quote 1 night 18/7/18 - + fees) Note not all five travellers need accommodation, however we have sought a quote that would provide an option if others are travelling from the region/distance and they need a place to stay.

Flights: \$2922 : 5 return flights: Adelaide, Melbourne, Perth, Sydney, Tamworth
